- 1) This is regarding the automatic entry of the first goal set date in SCOTI as the intake/registration date. Why is this being done? A provider may not have set a goal at this time yet. If further assessment needs to be done to determine that goal, you have then taken away part of the time allowed (one year) for the youth to attain that goal. My understanding from TEGL 7-99 is that you must set a minimum of one goal per year but does not say that it has to be the day of registration.***

This is being done because of the definitions provided by USDOL in Attachment E - Revised Workforce Investment Act Standardized Record Data (WIASRD). Item 626 - Date Goal #1 is set is the data item that defines the date we have to report to the federal government when the first goal is set. In its definition it states, "The date goal was set is the date a goal was identified for the youth, except that the date the first goal is set must be recorded as the registration date."

USDOL requires that the first goal set date be the same as registration according to these instructions.

- 2) I have been checking for wage record on WIA participants, and "yes" is checked as being employed for the quarter, but some of the wages are being reported on SCOTI as '1'.***

***What does '1' mean?***

The data being reported is out of the acceptable reported range, (under \$2,900 or over \$30,000)
